



Marists Attend Chicago Conference



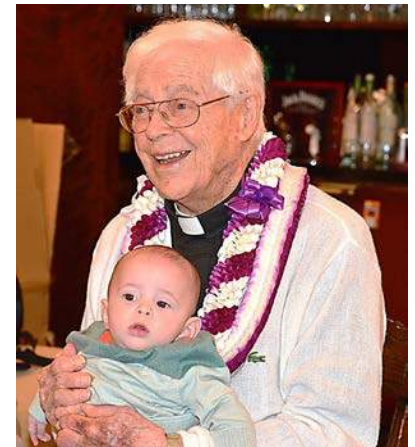
Marists Faustino (Tito) Cruz, U.S. Province, and Yvan Mathieu, Canadian Province, recently attended a Conference for Academic Deans in Chicago, Illinois. The “New Models for New Times: Managing Educational Change” conference was sponsored by the Association of Theological Schools (ATS). ATS is formed by more than 270 graduate schools of theology in the United States and Canada. The mission of ATS is “to promote the improvement and enhancement of theological schools to the benefit of communities of faith and the broader public.” Tito is currently serving as Associate Dean of Academic Affairs at Seattle University in the School of Theology and Ministry and is Associate Professor of Practical Theology. Yvan is an Associate Professor of Theology at St. Paul University in Ottawa, Canada.

Meanwhile across the Pacific at St. Catherine’s Coyle Hall (on the island of Kaua’i) 100 parishioners gathered to be Skyped-in to join the SF-centennial celebration, island-style (pot luck food, dance, song, music). As is fitting for a 70 year professed Religious priest, Fr. Coyle began the gathering by presiding at Eucharist celebrating the Feast of the Annunciation the day on which he was born in 1915 in Dublin, Ireland. Marists Fathers Alfred Puccinelli and Dennis Steik joined Fr. Coyle at the altar.

The NDV Community provided the meal (menu selected by the centenarian-honoree) and the libations feasted on by all present. The meal was served by NDV YAs (Young Adults), as well as by the pastor, Marist René Iturbe, and school principal, lay-Marist Mary Ghisolfo. The attendees from Kaua’i presented Fr. Coyle with a

plaque signed by Kaua’i Island Mayor Bernard Carvalho, Jr., proclaiming March 25, 2015 as Fr. Patrick Coyle Day on the Island.
