We arrived on Friday evening from our various areas of busyness to this haven of peace owned and managed by the Marist Brothers. Comfortable accommodation and good food complimented the well thought out program prepared by our presenters which led us into dialogue, reflection and meditation that both challenged and energised us.

Andrew Dumas set the scene on Friday evening – "**Be still and know that I am God**" by presenting Eccelsiastes 3: 1-15 and a Nooma video – shells.




Saturday Morning Maria Baden continued the theme – "**Be still and know that I am**" with Matthew 6: 25-34 and allowing us experience the "I am" in Christian Meditation

Unfortunately Andrew became our "suffering servant" confined to his room with a 24hour virus so Margaret Woods and Maria Baden carried us through the next session — "Be still and know" Psalm 139, onions and Shrek helped us look at our true selves.

Each session allowed people time to express themselves in journal writing, Haiku verses, art & craft, or silent prayer. After lunch we had a couple of hours free to roam the farmlands, walk the labyrinth, read, rest, meditate or chat to someone.

Session 4 with Margaret – "**Be still**" looked at Jesus calming the storm in Mark 34: 35-41 with another of Rob Bell's





vignettes on rain and how we deal with our own life storms.

From this session we went to the beautiful chapel where Fr Paul Mahony sm celebrated Mass of Trinity Sunday with us around the altar.

Sunday morning, after Christian Meditation, Fr Paul presented the final session which brought together all the other sessions — "Be" — Luke 10: 38-42 "Mary has chosen the better part". A very robust dialogue helped clarify our own understanding of the balance between work and prayer or being and doing. In the ritual farewell we shared various words and thoughts that had touched us during the weekend. The final surprise was the gift to each of us of a Woodstock Chime from the Retreat Team. Something we will treasure and use with our own Marist prayer groups.

The well planned program led us through an insightful process of personal and shared experiences. Thank you Andrew, Maria, Margaret and Father Paul, for all the hard work that went into the preparation of this Retreat weekend and for your tireless, joyful, spiritual presence during the weekend. May Mary continue to lead many to her Son through each one of you who seek to live her daily "Fiat".


