In August this year an historic meeting of Marist Laity was held at Los Negrales when international delegates attended the European Marist Laity Conference, making it the first worldwide meeting.

Fifteen International delegates then went on to La Neyliere for a meeting which included a pilgrimage to the Marist places.

As part of that we had the opportunity to reaffirm our commitment to Mary on the steps at Fourvière and La Capucinière.



A Message from Michel Macquet, Coordinator of WMLC (International Marist Lay Network)



In September the Provincials and Major Superiors of the Society of Mary gathered for their Annual Review Consultation (ARC) at La Neyliere. Fr Alejandro Munoz shared on the recent Lay Marist international meeting at Los Negrales and La Neyliere.

The Provincials and Major Superiors recognized the autonomy and genuine identity of Marist Laity. They are ready to support us in the preparation for the General Chapter in the spirit of the European directory and in particular to sit at the same table and explore possible projects we could lead and share together.

For this, it will be necessary to develop contact and appropriate social, charitable evangelization projects which can help the renewal of the church. All this without losing the crucial insight that we are called to "*build a Colinian Laity for today*". It was acknowledged that it is necessary for us to speak and act together. Following Los

Negrales the General Administration asks us to raise some projects for the General Chapter in 2017. The projects can be completely new or the development of an existing programme. An outline of what the submitted projects will need to contain is at the end of this message.

We have planned a meeting in Europe for February on the theme "How can we promote Marist Laity and our common mission following on from the Los Negrales conference?" Let's give ourselves a deadline

of December 2016 for presenting these projects which will leave us a year to work on them before the Chapter. We make our own one of the conclusions of the participants from the recent Marist workshop in San Francisco.

"Our Marist charism meets one of the great needs of people wishing to find faith in the lonely crowds of urban anonymity — a welcoming non-judgmental presence which offers compassion and companionship in the pilgrimage through life."

Our challenge is to find Mary's way to show how the Marist approach to the Gospel offers a source of renewal and hope for our fatigued and troubled societies today. *Michel Macquet. WMLC Network*

- 3. Opportunities
- 4. Needs and possibilities for sharing amongst the Marist family
- 5. Realistic consideration of the needs of the sector and the available resources
- 6. Hoped for outcomes and goals.



News from Marist Laity Groups and Countries



Philippines:

For the first time in eight years and the second in Philippine Marist Lay history all the Marist Lay groups will gather for a

General Assembly on Monday 30th November which is a national holiday.

It is hoped some international Lay Marists may share part of this event on Skype.

To help fund the work they plan to register an income generating project with the security and exchange commission. The groups will follow the European training and formation programme. *Kenneth Bretana*

Canada:

Spain: Meeting at Lardero – La Rioja – SPAJN

During the weekend of 25-27 September, in La Rioja (Spain), the Marist Brothers from the province "Ibérica" gathered 174 youth leaders (25-30 year olds), who are charged with formation and youth training from different communities of the province. Some Marist brothers, school managers and leaders responsible for youth groups were also present.

The motto and focus of the meeting was "*All new, in You*". The gathering was based on the 200th anniversary of the Fourvière Promise, to be commemorated next year and for this reason, some representatives from the other branches of the Marist family were invited. Everyone shared experiences in the mission as religious and lay people of the Marist family, especially about their work with young people in their parishes, schools and groups. Moreover, some talked about their vocational and spiritual journey, which was an inspi-

He was accompanied in this important day in his religious life by many from the other Marist communities in Spain and some Spanish Marist Priests concelebrated the Mass. We pray for Daniel so that he can carry out his ministry in the Church with his Marist style, wherever he develops and fulfills his mission.
