In recent years, with your support, Brother Charlie has raised almost half a million dollars to finance training. Yes, the cheeky grin is still there. The irrepressible willingness to go the extra mile for others remains fresh but now his seventy-five year old knees are complaining. He is set for knee-replacement surgery as soon as he clocks up the magic 2015 quota of 500km for Marist Seminarians in this, his special Marist 'golden year'.
