“URBAN EVANGELISATION AND THE MARIST CHARISM TODAY”, SUMMARY TEXT, 15 AUGUST



The Marist City Centre Mission Conference and Seminar took place in London over 3 months ago, and perhaps it is now just a distant memory for most of us. However, 2 things happened this month to rekindle some of the fruits of the event. Firstly, participants received a postcard which they addressed to themselves near the end of the event, as a reminder of key personal points. Echoing the urgings of Pope Francis, John Hannan reminded the SM in his letter (“*Time to Look Outward: The mission of the Society of Mary today*”, 2016), that it is time for the SM to rediscover its missionary purpose. In response to this challenge the text speculates, Fr Colin and his companions faced the challenge of a change of era, so “*in fact, we find ourselves wondering whether the Society of Mary was founded precisely for this new world and its culture!*”

He writes: "Andreas, as a great manager, organised my trip in two steps. I first took a train and met him in Cologne and together we followed a guided tour of the cathedral and also other significant places for us as Marists in the city. The second step was a flight to Oslo that evening. I enjoyed the rhythm of community life at Strømmen. Everything is done naturally and simply. I am impressed and thank God and Mary, for the amazing pastoral work entrusted to the Marist community in



the Oslo diocese – the education and youth ministry, retreat centers, etc. At the Catholic cathedral, we had the opportunity to concelebrate with the bishop of Oslo at a Mass for vocations. The other trips (Fram museum, Glomma river etc.), were unforgettable. For me, my short stay in the Strømmen Marist community is a putting into practice of the No.158 and 224 of our Constitutions."

RETREAT FOR YOUNG ADULTS, LA NEYLIÈRE, 24-30 JULY



4 young adults participated in the retreat "Sources". During this silent retreat based on the Ignatian

Spiritual Exercises, participants were accompanied by Pascal Boidin (FR), Hubert Bonnet-Eymard (FR) and Tom Kouijzer (NL). It gave them the opportunity to take time to focus on their relationship with God and their vocation as disciples of the Lord. The programme consisted in daily meetings with a spiritual director in which points for prayer were given, and a daily Eucharist. The compact size of the group helped to sustain an atmosphere of recollection and discernment. All the participants indicated that they had experienced *Sources* as a life-giving and significant moment on their spiritual journey. This initiative definitively merits a repeat!
