National Conference of the Italian Marist Family, August 27th to 31st

Mario Castellucci (It) writes, "10 SMSM and 5 SM Sisters, 9 Marist Fathers along with 16 lay people with 4 children experienced this period of encounter, reflection, prayer and sharing. Sr. Georgeanne Marie Donovan (Superior General of the SMSM) guided reflection on the theme, "Marist *Spirituality in a Time of Crisis*". It focused on different levels of the crisis (within the person, society, and the Church ...) to see what answers Marists might offer. This was the third phase of





journey а of renewal which commenced a few years ago. It was the occasion for Marists as Family to pause, look again at the gift we have received, current the the reality, challenges this presents, and the responsibility all this evokes".



Provincial Council (PC) and joint meeting with the English regional council October $7^{th} - 8^{th}$

The final stage of the PC journey around the regions led to the city of Hull, England where Marists have ministered in education, parishes and chaplaincy for many years. The two councils examined the relationship between provincial and regional priorities. Since Notre Dame de France is located in England this adds an important dimension to ministry in the region. Marists continue to animate the national shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham with inter-regional collaboration: While Joe Rooney (Ire) returns to Ireland in November after 3 years, Giovanni Colosio (It)

arrives to spend his sabbatical year there. Hull and Walsingham both require further discernment about the best way to continue serving people. On its own agenda, the PC finalised plans for the forthcoming workshop and Council of the Province meeting (November 2013). HBE consulted the PC on matters related to CS2013, Dublin including a discussion of the Honner Report on Governance in the SM. Formation, finance, planning for the year 2014, as well as on-going work in the regions occupied the remaining exchanges.

The English region recently purchased a new regional house in Blackburn where three houses now form one community of 7 confrères. Daniel Fernandez (Esp) at Ranong, on the Myanmar-Thai border

During the summer Daniel joined Marists in the project at Ranong, <u>www.maristthailand.org</u> and had the opportunity to get to know the reality of migrants from Myanmar living there. The experience led him to the view that "learning English and Thai can make the difference for them in having and not having a future". He reached the conclusion that "They need many things, especially good education and basic resources, but I have realised that the only thing I could do for them now is to keep their memory alive and their voice loud". Renovation work begins on the main building, La Neylière
