# 2. Presentation Expanded Outline

#### Introduction (3 minutes)

- Greeting to parishioners with enthusiasm e.g Good morning!
- My name is \_\_\_\_\_ and we are part of a team in the parish which has been involved with the Sydney Alliance. The Sydney Alliance is a coalition of faith groups, community organisations and unions who work together with politicians and key leaders in Sydney to build a better city. With 49 partner organisations, it is an Alliance built on strong, long term relationships.
- As a partner, the Archdiocese through Cardinal Pell has recognised that this is an opportunity for Catholics to be involved in civic and public life.
- Today, we are inviting you to an event which will launch a campaign towards the 2015 State election. It will be held at the Sydney Town Hall on the 26<sup>th</sup> March 2014 and we are expecting 2000 people to be present.





- Over the last few months, the leaders of the Alliance, including us have listened to everyday citizens, researched and agreed that there at 3 issues which people have felt is most important to them. These are:
  - Affordable Housing eg. Homelessness, entry into property market difficult for first home buyers because of increase prices, shared accommodations for disadvantaged Australians
  - o Transport public transport issues, traffic congestion, cost and efficiency
  - Supported Job Pathways young indigenous and pacific islander, Bankstown women factory workers/sweatshops

#### The Relational Meeting (3 Minutes)

- In the spirit of the Alliance, we want to give you an opportunity to discuss these issues with the person next to you or with someone you have no met yet.
- The question we would like you to answer is:
  - Thinking about these three issues, affordable housing, transport and supported job pathways, what is your family's experience in relation to these issues?

#### Catholic Social Teaching (1 Minute)

- Why is it important for us to participate in public life?
- The Catechism of the Catholic Church encourages us to, as far as possible citizens should take an active part in public life.<sup>1</sup>
- Pope Francis has emphasised our calling to be lights of the world.
- Catholic Social Teaching guides us in our social justice action. It calls us to solidarity with our brothers and sisters to strive to work for the common good.

#### Commitment Cards (2 minutes)

- As you entered the parish today, you were handed commitment card. These commitment cards ask you to live your faith in a different, unique way.
- Please complete the card and return them to us at the end of the mass.
- If you are not doing anything on March 26<sup>th</sup>, we invite you to tick that first box and join us in solidarity on the night
- If you can sing, we ask that you let us know, so that you can be a part of a 300 person choir made up of people from various partners of the Alliance. The choir will kick start the assembly for the night
- If you are a devotional person and recognise that our city needs prayers, we will be having a prayer vigil right before the assembly to pray for the intentions of our leaders and for our city
- If you can take care of the children of those attending the Alliance, please tick that box
- If you can't make it on the night but you are interested in finding out more, please tick that box

#### The Ask (1 minute)



#### 2. PARISH GROUPS STRATEGY

A great way to meet your parish turnout commitment is to focus on inviting the existing groups in your parish. The key is to identify how their personal interests are met by attending the assembly or are met by participating in the Sydney Alliance. The table below is an example on how you can organise and delegate a leader in your team to meet with key leaders in these groups. This gives you an opportunity to personally invite their community to the assembly and build stronger relationships in your parish!

Parish Group	Points of Possible interests	Core Team leader who will contact key person in group
Youth Group	Choir Social Justice Large gathering	Mr. A – current youth coordinator
Novena Community	Prayer Vigil night Understands that we need to align our plans with God Devotional	Ms. B – attends Novenas from time to time
St Vincent's Group	Social Justice Change for disadvantaged people in Sydney	Mr. C – volunteer at Parish Vinnies group

# 3. Why Should They Attend?

Below are points to help you encourage you parishioners to attend the evening and be involved in the Alliance after the March Assembly

#### "Because I asked you"

- Make an effort to make sure that people are spoken to personally
- The majority of people are more open to attending when they have someone to actually speak about it with

#### "Because I have a role to give you"

- o For some, this may be a way for people to step up and get involved
- o Roles include: Organisational Guides, Choir, Front of House Team, Organisational Photographer, the person who brings the flags, Childcare
- It can be a good way to develop their skills

#### "We need vou"

- Members make the organisation and organisations form the Sydney Alliance
- It is only through the help of these members that we can contribute to this common good we are striving for

#### · "We are launching the campaign"

- o Be a part of the new movement in Sydney's civil society
- o Learn about the issues which will become our city-wide agenda and what they can do to help





#### • "Connected to the issues"

- These are issues which affect everyone in Sydney
- Obviously some issues will be more relevant than others to different people so identify their self-interest and share why these issues would affect them

#### "Experience solidarity with our neighbours"

- Very rarely do we have an opportunity to meet and work together with others outside of our comfort zones
- This is a great way to experience the diversity of Sydney and be a part of making it a better place

### 4. What May Prevent Them From Coming?

Some people are genuinely eager to come but there may be some minor issues which may prevent parishioners from attending

Below are some common issues which are relatively easy to solve and their responses:

- "I was told too late"
  - Avoid this by letting people know early

#### "Parking is a pain"

- Given that the venue is a 1 minute walk from Town Hall Railway Station it would probably be best to consider taking public transport
- o Alternatively there are a few parking lots located near the venue which include:
  - Wilson Parking St Andrews House Town Hall Car Park (\$8)
  - Wilson Parking Citipark Sydney Car Park (\$9)
  - Wilson Parking Darling Park Car Park (\$9)
- o Or check the carparking info website

#### "I have children to look after"

- There will be childcare services available on the night at Town Hall in one of the adjoining rooms
- But still for looking for volunteers

## 5. Turnout Tips

Some points that we mentioned when discussing effective turnout:

- 3 Components of Turnout:
  - 1. Participants
  - 2. Organisational guides (Floor team) 1:10 Organisational guides: Participants (*Please select leaders in your parish to be in charge of 10 people on the night. These "organisational guides" will serve as guides on the night prompting their group to stand, clap or sit etc. contact Qwayne Guevara on <a href="mailto:gwayne.guevara@sydneycatholic.org">gwayne.guevara@sydneycatholic.org</a> or on 0439 584 221 to discuss)*
  - 3. Setting the organizational briefing
- Relational Aspect
  - Finding common interest
  - Meeting self interests
  - o 1:1
- Constant Promotion





- o Flyers, Mass emails should only be used as reminders
- Follow up on maybes
- o Create a good vibe for the assembly
- Reason to attend
  - o Issues of interest
  - o Talk about why it is important to them
  - o Talk through barriers which may prevent them from coming
- Work on getting a Hard Yes as opposed to a Soft Yes
  - o Give clear directions/instructions
  - o A hard yes is one that is registered on the website
  - Remember that although there may be a certain number confirmed there is usually a 20% drop off
