Fourvière, Lyons, France - the place

Since 1170 there has been a shrine at Fourvière, dedicated to Our Lady. It continues to be a place of pilgrimage where believers come to place their future in Mary's hands. In 1816 it was to the little chapel of this ancient sanctuary that twelve young men came to commit themselves to form the religious congregation of the Society of Mary as soon as possible. There is a plaque on the chapel wall to commemorate this event. In the years that followed, the Marist Family would be made up of several branches and so this shrine is of foundational significance to all Marists. Before leaving Lyon on October 15th 1836, Peter Chanel hung around the neck of the statue of the Infant Jesus at Notre Dame de Fourvière, a gilded heart which contained the

of prayer consecration of departing the missionaries and their names. Since Marists then. departing for Oceania continued this tradition until the 1980s.
