From the Provincial

Dear Confreres

Since the last Provincial Circular, I had the privilege of attending the annual 10 day ARC meeting in Rome with the GA and the major superiors from all around the SM world.

I have also been able to do a "sort of" retreat with the confreres at Hunters Hill under Bishop Peter Cullinane of New Zealand.

I used the latter to help me process a great deal of what had occurred in and around the ARC meeting.

'Conversations'

The ARC meeting this year had a slightly different format. Two and half of the days were allocated to "conversations", the opportunity for members of the GA to meet one-onone with the major superiors, and for interest groups (eg MAP members) to get together.

It was a successful innovation but kept us working quite hard. Meeting

up with Marists from around the globe is a great blessing because when you meet them you realize that we really have some great confreres.

One important outcome

Between ARC and the retreat I rushed to get out to confreres in the Province a letter with news from ARC regarding one important outcome of the Rome meeting many would have been most interested in, "where are we now the SM restructuring"?

I thought it important to get this news out before it became stale or before some aspects of it filtered through the unreliable rumour channels.

I am sorry the letter contained so little detail but at this stage there is little detail to share.

Pat Devlin, Superior of the Asia District, and I through Skype contact are working on the instructions given us by the General Administration during ARC and we will have a presentation ready for our respective Councils in November.

A working paper

With feedback from the Councils, with Peter McMurrich and Chris Ganzon joining the working team, we will produce a paper for discussion by all confreres in the Asia / Australia units in early 2017.

"Reconfiguration" must not become the bogey man that dominates our existence over the coming year.

It must not sap all life and energy out of us and prevent us living out and growing the Marist life and mission that was inspired by our last Provincial Chapter.

General Chapter 2017

Over the coming months we also have to prepare for the General Chapter of the Society, from 17th Sept to 10th Oct, 2017.

We can begin by praying and asking the Lord for a deep and true conversion in our Marist life; we can

This is surely going to be one of the most important General Chapters in the history of the Society of Mary.

'Choosing life'

At this Chapter we have before us the classic invitation issued by Moses to the people of Israel: "I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Choose life". (Deut 30:19)

"Choosing life" for Marists, both at the international level and at our Provincial level, means getting back to living our Marist life in a realistic and genuine way.

How does choosing life translate for us in Australia? We can ask the question, what is the thing that really kills our Province?

Individualism

The spirit of 'individualism' has been extolled in this Province by many as a virtue and strength for the last 50 years. However, I maintain it has not given life to our Province as a whole.

It has helped some individuals but has hurt us as a whole.

A big reason for us being in our current situation where we lack a number of vibrant communities of a few confreres living together as brothers, and of having next to no corporate works, is because so many of us choose to 'do our own thing' as opposed to 'being in a team'.

Is it any wonder that we have not been able to attract vocations over the last 30 years? What young man would want to hitch his wagon to our train?

Getting focused

It is never too late to turn things around. Over the coming months and years we have to get *focused*; live more *overtly as Marists* in spirituality and community life; *be* international; work collegially; work with the laity; be courageous. (CS 13) This is the real challenge before us.

In the light of these 'beatitudes', that were mentioned in the last provincial circular, I encourage everyone to actively participate in the planned regional meetings over the next six months.

Crucial issues

The November regional gathering will address the crucial issues of finances and sale of property and next year we will need to attend to the question of reconfiguration in the light of ARC.

In the process of these meetings the Council and I are inviting all confreres to accept ownership of our future and participate in the life of our province.

Is the future of the Society of Mary all doom and gloom? Certainly not. In the last month I have heard on a couple of occasions a very strong message of hope coming through.

It came from John Hannan, citing Br Sean Salmon FMS at the ARC meeting, and it came again in the last conference of our retreats given by Bishop Cullinane, citing Cardinal Godfried Danneels from 25 years ago.

Message of hope

I would love all confreres to be as encouraged by their message of hope as I was.

Hope is like being in a big black hole – but you can see the light at the end of the tunnel and it is very possible to get to that light, to get out of the hole.

Being in the hole is where we are. Perhaps, as Br Séan would suggest, 'It may be God's blessing that we are in our present place because this can be purifying for us. It is from here that we can be regenerated and grow anew in that light we are heading towards.' Let us work together to see the light, choose life and together address all that is facing the province.

Fr Hans Zollner SJ interview

MCC Pilgrimage

In the last week of September ten pilgrims from Marist Schools established by the Marist Fathers and Marist Sisters in Australia set out on a two-week pilgrimage to Marist places in Rome and France.

The pilgrimage is part of the Marist Charism and Culture program and this first pilgrimage involved the principals of Woodlawn (Chris Comerford), Bellambi (Amanda Wilson), Burnie (Adrian Drane), and Ann Ireland (Marist Sisters Woolwich).

It is hoped these leaders, with an enhanced knowledge of Marist roots and heritage, will be more able to impart the Marist ethos and traditions to their respective college communities.

Accompanying the college leaders were Tour Leaders, Glenn Roff and Kim Evans, Vicky Evans (Trinity College, Lismore), Peter Ireland (Sydney Cath Education Office), Caroline Thompson (Directory Mercy Partners), and chaplain / humble Marist guru and guide, Gerry Hall.

The pilgrims spent some days in Rome (4 days) retracing the footsteps of Jean-Claude Colin in that city.

A highlight was the warm welcome of the Monteverde community and





International Theologate where they shared the Eucharist and around meals had the opportunity to meet Marists.

The more extensive visit to Marist places in France (4 days at La Neylière, 3 days at Belley and Lyon) was ably guided by Ray Chapman and Sr Teri O'Brien sm with great use made of the excellent pilgrimage booklets prepared by Ron Nissen.

Based at La Neylière and Belley, visits were made to the most significant Marist places associated with Colin, Champagnat, Chavoin and Chanel. Highlights included the celebration of the Eucharist at the Le Puy and Fourvière shrines as well as La Neylière, Coutouvre and Cerdon. Finally, there were visits to Ars and Taizé.

For the pilgrims, long after other details become blurred, Tony Corcoran's warm welcome to the General House and his enlightening tour of the Monteverde archives and chapel; John Larsen's invitation to visit the vibrant International Scholasticate; Donato Kivi (Rome) and Ray Chapman (France) assistance as guides; the hospitality of the La Neylière community; and Sr Teri's dynamism, enthusiasm and historical knowledge, will long remain fond memories.





Provincial Retreats – 2016 Bishop Peter Cullinane, emeritus Bishop of Palmerstone North, NZ, led the two Province Retreats this year.



Gerry Arbuckle's award.

Congratulations to confrere Gerald Arbuckle on receiving from Catholic Health Australia, the peak body for Catholic health care in Australia, its highest annual award.

The Maria Cunningham Lifetime Contribution Awarded was presented to Gerry at the association's annual Conference on 30th August.

The citation for this award recognized Gerry's "lifetime's dedication to Catholic health and aged care in Australia and North America".. **St Peter Chanel's, Woolwich** Confreres and Hunters Hill parishioners were informed in early October that the Provincial Administration were investigating, with planning company RPS, a possible subdivision of land at St Peter Chanel's Woolwich.

St Peter Chanel church sits on the front of a 5,248 m² block and when purchased by Fr Claude Joly sm on 21st Dec 1890 he wrote to the Superior General – "the site then has been bought in our name. It is big enough to allow part of it to be resold if that became useful.....". That time has come.

Next year the Marist Fathers will have been involved in the Hunters Hill/Woolwich area since 1847, 170 years.

As we decline in numbers we need to look at ways to care for Marists in retirement years and to support the ongoing Mission of the Society.

Over the coming months we are beginning the process to place before Hunters Hill Council the subdivision of the Futuna Street, Woolwich property.

The concept being considered is to sell the north facing part of the site for Seniors Housing.

Being close to the Church, bus stops and still on the Woolwich peninsula this concept could be attractive to senior parishioners of Hunters Hill.

These plans do not include any alteration to the services provided

by St Peter Chanel's as part of the Holy Name of Mary parish.

Our Lady of the Journey – Rome. During September a second replica statue of *Our Lady of the Journey* from the church in Takada has been presented to the Marist Fathers.

The first replica was given to the Australian Province in thanks for their contribution to the Marist mission in Japan.

The second was given to the General House at Monteverde in recognition that the Japanese SM mission that truly was an international SM mission.

The Rome replica was blessed and mounted on an attractive stand in a prominent place in one of the main corridors of the General House during the ARC meeting of General Council and major superiors from around the Marist world.

Tony Corcoran was largely responsible for the tasteful and appropriate treatment of this lovely statue in Rome.

Acknowledging our lack of class in Sydney a more dignified stand has been commissioned and the statue will be given prominence at Villa Maria.


Woolwich Staff Day
