From the Chairperson of MMC... "The Name of God is Mercy"

At the beginning of this year Pope Francis published a small book called 'The Name of God is Mercy'. For Francis, mercy captures the depth and mystery of who God is - the heart of God is rich in mercy and full of compassion. We see mercy lived out in the life, parables and mission of Jesus. Time and time again Pope Francis returns to this central theme of mercy.

Pope Francis has declared this year as a 'Year of Mercy' and is always speaking out on behalf of the powerless, the homeless and refugees no matter if he is in Rome or visiting countries such as Cuba, Mexico, Greece and Armenia. He has welcomed refugees into the Vatican.

Pope Francis has just completed his visit to Poland where he celebrated **World Youth Day** with thousands of young people from around the world including walking through the Gate of Mercy with young people. At the closing Mass he challenged the youth that God is demanding 'real courage' from them: the courage to exercise the power of mercy and forgiveness to heal the world and to believe in a new humanity.

A Shelter for Street Children Balay Pasilungan - Mercy in action


Balay Pasilungan is a ministry of the Marist Fathers and is a care centre for homeless and abandoned street children. It endeavours to reach out to care for children who through no fault of their own find themselves without care. Fr. Lionel sm walks the city streets every Friday where he meets and works with the most vulnerable of the street children.

The live-in shelter also offers education, meals, clothing, medical care, sports, spiritual and values formation, case management and family integration. The Marist Mission Centre supports this program.

'A little boy's prayer is answered'...

The statue of the Holy Family is located in Fr. Lionel's office and this small boy would often ask to come into his office so that he could 'rub' the statue of Mary as his way of prayer in the hope of finding his own mother.


