### EUROPEAN PROVINCIAL CHAPTER, LA NEYLIÈRE (9 - 19 JANUARY)

21 capitulants were assisted by 2 consultants, 3 interpreters, 2 secretaries and the local community and staff. The chapter used a series of workshops and interactive processes to explore selected themes (listed below) in the European context. An innovation for the event was to avail of the skill of a "graphic facilitator" who created visual records of the evolving thoughts and statements of capitulants. These were much

appreciated and in addition, they were beautiful to look at. The chapter formally also confirmed the new Provincial Statutes it has been using since 1 July.

One capitulant writes: The overall theme was "With our present resources, what is God calling us Marists to be in the changing context of Europe, today and into the future?" The following steps for the chapter were aimed at raising awareness: Our Marist identity and how to live it out in religious community, as an expression of the Work of Mary. — Our Vocation as Marists to promote the Work of Mary. — Exploring the contribution all of us can make to the Work of Mary as Mission. In this and in all the following steps we had marvellous helpers in





Virginie Allard and Marie Caron, two animators leading us through the process so that each one of us had a say in it with his ideas and his experience. It was an amazing and life-giving event; this process engaged each of us and we had the privilege of enjoying the richness in the brethren. There was a lot of exchange which gave rise to respect and fraternity (brotherhood). The concluding round of exchange, brief (one

word each!) said it all: Brotherhood, encouragement, hope, life, peace, strength, fraternité, ...amour. As somebody mentioned: "I have never been at a chapter that

was so joyful and life-giving".

**Another capitulant writes:** I guard the days of chapter in my memory as a beautiful experience: an experience of quality due, I think, to the skill and style of Virginie. I have to say I was not totally satisfied with the space given to discussion and to the vote for orientations. On the other hand, I remember a reflection heard often on the eve of the chapters of previous years: texts are probably not what we need the most today! I can only hope that we will be able to communicate to the whole province something of the quality of "being together" during these days and that, furthermore, the provincial team will be able to build on the chapter and its conclusions to animate and lead the province for the next 4 years.

To be more closely united, work more creatively, and act in greater solidarity we form one province beyond national limitations...
