ALOIS GREILER SM (GER) - VISIT TO GREENLAND, AUGUST 2017



“Beautiful Greenland! And at the same time exotic, unique, rich in history, challenging in climate, and a radical diaspora experience of the Catholic Church. The St Joseph Sisters in Copenhagen mentioned to me that the only parish in Greenland, in the capital city of Nuuk, had no resident priest. I offered my services and was accepted to help out for 3 Sundays. To get to Nuuk is already something – geologically, it is in America, and yet, is a neighbour to the country of Canada. Travelling there takes time and depends on the weather. The Catholics gave me a fine welcome. About 24 parishioners arrived for Sunday mass - the only service in the whole week.



Of these, about 20 are from the Philippines! I admire this small Catholic community for its fidelity to their faith, Church, and liturgy. I learned a lot about the long and rich history of Greenland and about its present challenges - its political status, climate change, and social issues. Was I the first Marist to serve there? Who knows? In any case, it was a very enriching experience for myself.”

ITALIAN BURSARS' MEETING, VILLA SANTA MARIA, MONCALIERI, TORINO, 14 SEPTEMBER

MAURICE AUDIBERT SM - A VISIT TO BUCHAREST, 15-31 AUGUST

Frs Mario Castellucci (national administrator), and Marcello Pregno (national bursar) organised a meeting of Italian bursars. All local bursars were present, including Fr Andrea Volonnino who is responsible for the section of the Roman community, based in Via Livorno. They reflected on the next steps to be taken in the process of centralising financial administration. In addition, they analysed the 2016 consolidated accounts for Italy, and shared best-practice in relation to recording expenses and income. It was also an opportunity to share meals and prayer, and informal chats. All stayed in Moncalieri the night before the meeting and left on the morning of the 15th.



Maurice Audibert (Fr) writes:

"I collaborate with an organisation called "Classes" in Lyon. It is an association which takes care of the needs of children from "Romani" immigrant families in relation to their school attendance. It



accompanies the parents in their responsibilities too. In this context, and having seen the difficulties between Romanians and the Romani people (rejection, lack of understanding, hostility, rampant racism), I received an invitation from the Marist Brothers in Romania, to spend two weeks in their communities in Bucharest. In partnership with the country's social services, they provide fulltime and part-time residential care, welcoming children and adolescents in their hostels. One can only rejoice when one witnesses the conditions in which these children are housed by the Brothers and how they live and develop: material security, food, schooling, leisure. In the eyes of the Brothers, they are "children before being Romani"... The coexistence of two groups of people as different as Romani and Romanians on the same territory is difficult. Rejected, excluded in Romania, the Romani flee, looking for more favourable circumstances they are far from finding, in France or elsewhere..."
