A new premises for Our Lady of Hope, Moscow

Fr Michael Ryan (Eng) tells us that the Latin Rite Catholic francophone Chaplaincy has just moved into a new premises in the Chancery building in the compound of the Immaculate Conception Church. Before this the chaplaincy used a renovated cellar of the former Polish church after it was returned to Catholic use. Along with the Korean Catholic parish, it had shared a cellar used previously to store huge quantities of potatoes! Last year the Korean chaplaincy succeeded in building their own "cultural centre" just outside the city boundaries where they now celebrate Mass. The Francophone chaplaincy has also found a new space to hold its celebrations on Sundays at 12h15. Michael also celebrates a Eucharist at 09:30 inside the US Embassy compound, and there is another Mass at 18h00 in the domestic chapel of his apartment which is provided by the US Embassy in another diplomatic compound. A complicated and busy Sunday schedule!



City Centre Churches Ministry seminar, Paris, April 8th – 9th

“Direct evangelisation is the opportunity to put Christ at the disposal of the person one meets on the street”. “Its purpose is to make Christ available to that person, not to give them something - it is Christ who offers himself in these short ‘heart to heart’ conversations”. “The attitude of a ‘witness to God’ today is one of being an instrument made available to God himself, rather than to generate opposition to him!” Raphael Cornu Thénard (www.anuncio.fr/113), director of the movement Anuncio (www.anuncio.fr), shared these and many other thoughts and experiences in the course of the first morning of the seminar. The 10 participants from Passau (Germany), Toulon (France), Deventer (The Netherlands), London (UK), Dublin (Ireland), and the general and provincial administrations, went on to explore the ministry in the province and ways to support it. The group also had an opportunity to visit some churches in Paris, which as faith communities reach out to people outside their walls.

Council of the Province, Moncalieri, Turin, April 14th – 16th



A major task for the council was to finalise a text of new Statutes for the province. The sunny weather helped brighten up what can be otherwise, a rather dull activity! Now this job is completed, the next stage of the process is to submit the text to the superior general. Other items considered were the timeline of events over the next two years, and a proposal for the province to focus on its priority of vocation promotion over the coming year. Along with this, the council considered additional plans for the animation of its apostolic mission. Importantly, there was time also for the council to enjoy the lively hospitality of Corso Francia community.
