
PRAYER INTENTION

COUTOUVRE, 3 OCTOBER, BICENTENARY CELEBRATIONS OF THE MARIST SISTERS

The Marist Sisters invited an impressive gathering of people to celebrate with them, the Bicentenary of the Foundation of the Marist Sisters. 200 years ago, Jeanne-Marie Chavoin and her friend Marie Jotillon left Coutouvre, a nice little country village of Roanne, for Cerdon, at the invitation of Fr Pierre Colin, the brother and the parish priest of Fr Jean-Claude. These women were full of confidence in the Virgin Mary who they considered was counting on them to launch the work of the religious sisters. Sr Teri O'Brien S.M. had prepared the celebration with care and enthusiasm, to welcome a good number of her sisters - the superior general and two councillors from Rome, and sisters from Canada, Ireland, Australia, Fiji, the Philippines, Senegal...). In addition, there was also a good number of Marist Fathers - from Toulon, Lyon and La Neylière. Fr Paul Walsh representing the European provincial who was in Rome for the General Chapter, the Marist Brothers, SMSM Sisters, lay Marists were also there ... and above all, many residents of Coutouvre itself: Madam the Mayor, the current owner of the House of Jeanne-Marie, the local choir... and many more. The mass, the central moment of the day, was followed by a meal, all in an atmosphere of friendship and celebration. It must be said, sunshine illuminated the beautiful landscape to make the day all the more enjoyable. And here we are on the way to the 3rd centenary!
