Provincial's Letter

Dear Confreres

Pope Benedict, in his message for the World Day of Peace, January 1st, wrote about educating young people in justice and peace. It is an insightful and beautifully written message.

One paragraph moved me with its sensitivity to the current situation of many families. Pope Benedict writes:

"We are living in a world where families, and life itself, are constantly threatened and not infrequently fragmented. Working conditions which are often incompatible with family responsibilities, worries about the future, the frenetic pace of life, the need to move frequently to ensure an adequate livelihood, to say nothing of mere survival—all this makes it hard to ensure that children receive one of the *most precious of treasures:* the presence of their parents. This presence makes it possible to share more deeply in the journey of life and thus to pass on experiences and convictions gained with the passing of the years, experiences and convictions which can only be communicated by spending time together. I would urge parents not to grow disheartened! May they encourage children by the example of their lives to put their hope before all else in God, the one source of authentic justice and peace.

As religious, we can sometimes be isolated from these pressures that families are under. Yet, it is family life which sustains most people, and children can miss out on so much if their family does not function well.

In much of Australia, the phenomenon of "FIFO" workers is increasing. For those unfamiliar this this

phrase, it means: "Fly in, Fly out." A worker (typically a man) lives for a week or so with his family, then flies to his place of work for three or four weeks before flying home again. The flight time could be ten hours or more, eg: Tasmania to Western Australia. While mining companies find the practice efficient and expedient, it can be extremely tough on the workers and their families. In a sense, the worker has no real community. He belongs nowhere. His wife and children spend weeks without him, perhaps for many years. The pay is usually good, but the human cost is high.

It also has an effect on the communities near the mining facilities. Rather than their benefitting from new families coming to their area, the workers come and go with no sense of belonging and no need to put down roots. As well, there is often little benefit to local businesses and infrastructure.


Terry Dorey

Terry Dorey, a Marist scholastic at Toongabbie in the early 1970's passed away in Brisbane after a long battle with cancer.

Br Charles Howard FMS

Br Charles Howard, the first Australian-born Superior General of the Marist Brothers (1985-1993), passed away on 14th January in his community at St Gregory's, Campbelltown. Br Charles was 87.

Br Emili Turi (Superior Gen-



eral) came from Rome to attend Br Charles' funeral. Br Séan Sammon (ex-Superior General) came from the United States to delive the eulogy on behalf of the Brothers. Archbishop Philip Wilson of Adelaide, President of the Australian Bishops Conference and ex-pupil of Br Charles, was the Principal celebrant at the Requiem which was broadcast live around the world on webcast These are indicators of the great love and respect shown to a man who over recent davs has been called an education trailblazer and charismatic Catholic leader.

Australian Marist Fathers will remember Br Charles fondly for the 2002 Province Retreat he gave at Yamba, sharing his inspirational vision of the Marist world.

Albert Ernest Owen Jones

Owen Jones, father of Pius Jones, suffered a massive stroke on 22nd January and was taken to hospital where he was put on life support. The family gathered around Owen and Pius was able to anoint him. Owen then suffered a heart attack and passed away in the early hours of Tuesday, 24th January.

The funeral Mass for Owen was held at St Paul's Church, West Sunshine, on Monday, 29th January. A number of confreres were present.

Br Darryl Slater FMS

On 16th December, Gerry Hall presided at a Memorial Mass in St Joseph's College for his relative Brother Darryl Slater FMS, aged 63, who died suddenly in Cambodia on 11th December. Darryl's funeral service and cremation took place in Phnom Penh, Cambodia on 15th December.

Darryl was a Marist Brother for 45 years and had worked in a wide range of apostolates in Australia and overseas. For the last eleven years Darryl has given of himself most generously as a key member of the Marist Brothers team working with physically disabled young people in Cambodia. Through the Mission Centre, Australian Marist Fathers, supporting and collaborating with Br Terry Heinrich and Darryl at Lavalla School in Cambodia, came to know and appreciate Darryl very much over the years.

Donna Stewart

Donna, the adopted daughter of Bruce and Kate Stewart, brother and sister-in-law of Kevin, died suddenly in December. Donna was in her 30's. Her funeral was in Tamworth on 16th December.

Veronica Hungerford

Mrs Veronica Hungerford, the older sister of Kevin Kerley, passed away in Nambour Hospital on 22nd January. She had suffered a brain aneurism a few days before her death. Kevin was able to see his sister before she died.

Tony: Tuesdays to Fridays


Judy: Mondays to Wednesdays


