204 years ago at Fourvière, the Father Jean-Claude Colin with twelve seminarians and priests started the Society of Mary. This is where our illustrious congregation took shape to become the one we have today.

204 years have passed and the Society of Mary continues to walk with Mary in the world. This in order to perpetuate Father Colin's idea of making the World a Marist world. Today, many of these young people knock on the Marist door. They have the zeal and the taste and wish to

serve in this nascent Church, which needs each of us in the construction of this church, our mother. Each of us to be a promoter of vocations wherever we are.

I had a wonderful stay at La Neylière where Fr Jimmy and Fr Ray gave me a warm and wonderful welcome. Which makes me realize that there is a strong bond between all Marists in the world. This gives the impression of knowing each other, even if we don't always see each other. I was able to visit the Espace Colin and meditate at the tomb of the venerable Jean Claude and at the Pompeys cemetery where our confrères, like Etienne Déclas, rest.

So I was able to visit Fourvière ... Great was my joy to climb the many steps to reach Fourvière and to come down again. I had a time of Meditation in front of Our Lady of Fourvière. A unique moment to see the names of these Marists who have accepted to go on a mission to Oceania, a destination unknown to many.

Fourvière after 204 years reminds us that we are a Marist family, we missionaries in the world, we are the builders of this nascent Church and each of us must always remember our commitment as a Marist in the world. Let us therefore take the time to revisit our Marist places, to meditate on our constitutions, to revalue these places by our presence of quality and to give new life to our institutions.
