PROVINCIAL SOLIDARITY COMMISSION IN ROME, 25-26 JUNE

Jean-Bernard Jolly (Fr) writes, "At the invitation of Ben McKenna, assistant general in charge of the portfolio for Justice, Peace and Integrity of creation, the Solidarity Commission met in Rome over two days. While we met primarily to evaluate our previous activities and to plan for future initiatives, it was also a way to connect our work with this ministry at the level of the Society of Mary. We reviewed our previous visits to various communities and solidarity projects in the province. Looking to the future, we identified other possible collaborations, such as connecting with people in Brussels for European institutions involved with social action. In addition, the forthcoming European and International Gathering of Marist Laity (28 July - 2 August, Ireland: europeanlaymarists.zohosites.com) may be an occasion for further collaboration. Working with Ben McKenna enabled us to focus on the Papal Encyclical, Laudato Si which is of particular interest to him. Ben made connections between the Marist tradition, as articulated in General Chapter 2017 decisions, and Pope Francis' thinking developed in his Encyclical. The superior general, John Larsen, addressed the commission on the ongoing projects at the level of the whole Society of Mary. Our gratitude goes to the Monteverde community for the warmth of their welcome and assistance."

Annual Provincial Retreat, La Neylière, France, 21 – 28 July

It was preached by Fr Justin Taylor (NZ) on "Marist themes for today". "The status quo is not working" (General Chapter 2017: 8). What does the Society of Mary need today to be faithful to its vocation? His answer is, nothing short of a "reboot" or a reset of our parameters! Justin took a fresh look at familiar themes including: the name and purpose of the Society itself, the meaning of the person of Mary for Fr Colin, his vision for the future of the Church and secular society, the role of Marist communities in that vision, and a contemporary understanding of the spirituality which will help us build this future as Marists. Justin guided 27 confreres using all the expertise he built up over the last 6 years as he was writing the major biography of Fr Colin, published last year. Our challenge is to embody a contemporary expression of Fr Colin's intentions which he articulated in his 1872 Constitutions. We pray we are all up to the challenge!
