SOLIDARITY VISIT, PASSAU, GERMANY, MAY 2018











Mr Jean-Claude Boidin, and the Marist confrere Jean-Bernard Jolly (Fr), members of the Provincial Solidarity committee were welcomed for two days by the Marist community in Passau (Ger). The purpose of these visits is to support people engaged in diverse works of solidarity, and in addition to build networks with other Marists engaged in similar works. The members of the community are involved in multiple activities, and Jean-Claude and Jean-Bernard were able to sample only some of them. The main components of ministry in

Passau are a telephone crisis line service (bit.ly/TeleFonPassau), city centre evangelisation (bit.ly/VotivKirPassau), support for refugees, and chaplaincy service to the Marist Fürstenzell high school (mgf.de/MGF). These along with other

elements, give rise to creative activities undertaken in collaboration with others and inspired by the Marist spirit. The community does not see any separation between social and pastoral action. Both have the power to touch the inner dimension of the person. With this spirit, the community collaborates closely with the activities of the Diocese of Passau through chaplaincy services to a neighbouring prison and a local children's hospital. The diocesan Charitas organisation supports refugees although their flow through Passau has now almost ceased. Young Eritrean Christians have chosen the Marist church as their place of worship and meeting. Passau's local population is 50,000 and it is also home to a further 20,000 students attending its university from around Germany and overseas. The Marist community works alongside the diocese in their outreach to students. Even Bavaria experiences advancing secularism. The community see themselves as a Marist presence accompanying people respectfully and gently, far from a more forceful form of evangelisation.
