A QUEST FOR BEAUTY, GIANNI COLOSIO (IT), A MARIST ARTIST

A Marist since 1963 and ordained in 1969, Gianni has an exceptional ability to share the Gospel through painting and the written word: "I am a 77-year-old Italian Marist. The thirst for "il Bello", for Beauty, has been my daily bread and has kept me young.



I have just returned from my first experience in parish ministry (better late than never!), a full immersion in the midst of God's people, and this has been a great inspiration to my creativity. I divide my time between pastoral care of parishioners, painting and writing (these too are extremely effective pastoral instruments).



I recently mounted an exhibition on the Lucanian landscapes (watercolours) and published two essays on Mary: "La Madonna col Bambino nel Rinascimento" (Madonna and Child during the Renaissance") and "Umile ed alta più che creatura, la vita di Maria attraverso l'arte" (Humbler yet greater than any creature, the life of Mary through Art"). In addition, I published a pot-pourri of "reflections" which I gave to the parishioners on the occasion of my 50th anniversary of ordination.

In the Brescia community where I am now, which is truly an oasis, I am putting the final touches on a third essay, "Giovanni Bellini and Raffaello, madonneri" a meditation on the numerous Marian masterpieces of these two artists. I see myself as breaking the Bread of hope in a world both apprehensive and ill, reminding people that, "beyond our horizon", there is light and serenity. In other words, there is Beauty."
