OUR LADY OF THE ASSUMPTION SCHOOL: Grand Opening

On Tuesday, December 4, Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic School, a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence that serves students in Pre-K through eighth grade in Atlanta, Georgia, celebrated the Grand Opening of their new campus building. The building represents the largest expansion and enhancement to the school since opening in 1952. Atlanta Archbishop Wilton Gregory, Principal Lisa Cordell and Father Jim Duffy, S.M., pastor of OLA Catholic Church, were joined by **c**ommunity leaders, faculty, alumni and church and school members to celebrate the completion of the long-awaited expansion.

The new, state of the art, two-story building replaced an aging one-story facility. It provides a distinct, central location for the school's main entrance and includes a STEM lab, computer lab, three Pre-K classrooms, a middle school wing and two music rooms.

The new facility also includes an industrial kitchen and cafeteria to allow for onsite meal service and catering for both school and parish events. This expansion allows for much needed additional classrooms in grades kindergarten through five in the existing building.
