




## CELEBRATING A TREASURED MARIST PARTNERSHIP SINCE 1886

"Arriving in St. Paul August 30, 1886, Fr. John Baptist Bigot, previously superior of Jefferson College in Louisiana and Fr. John Mary Portal vicar at Lawrence, Massachusetts, took over the parish of St. Louis. When they arrived there was the tidy sum of \$120 on hand. A new school had been built and under their administration it was furnished. Foreseeing the necessity of expansion, Father Bigot bought a house and some additional land on Cedar Street."
