

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023: FROM SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA TO LISBON



We experienced WYD 2023 in two stages. We met up in Sahagun to spend a few days on the road to Santiago de Compostela. After a day at the hostel run by the Marists, which enabled us to get to know each other, to discover the Marists and to appreciate the warm welcome of the local community, we set off for Santiago de Compostela. Finally,

we went to Lisbon and were joined by the rest of our group to experience WYD: the week of preparation and the great celebrations of the closing weekend.

Who were we: young students connected with Notre Dame de France through the school chaplaincy, young professionals from the Gaudete group of Notre Dame de France, 4 seminarians from the Casa de Maria in Rome, 3 Marist religious (one SMSM and two Marist Fathers) and a few people from Toulon. There were 19 of us in Sahagun and along the way, and 61 in Lisbon.



What do I remember? On the Way of Saint James, we were able to create a group and enjoy meetings and good times of shared prayer. Mass in Santiago cathedral was the high point of the week. In Lisbon, we were among the crowds, very well received by the Marist Brothers who had made a school available to the Marist groups of the world. What I retain

from these days is the experience of a young and joyful Church and the words of the Pope who invites us to open our hearts by speaking simply and concretely. **"The Church is for everyone, for everyone, for everyone"**, he chanted with the hundreds of thousands of young people present.

So what's next? I am sure that these moments will bear fruit in the hearts of young people. Following in Mary's footsteps, they have been invited to set off in haste to meet Christ. After the time of sowing will come the time of harvest.

Father Colin looked forward to Marists writing books.

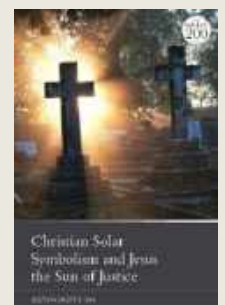
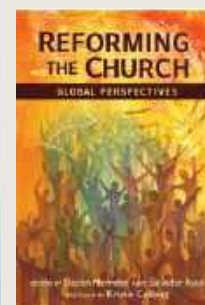

The 5th international meeting of the European Marist Laity was held in the High Leigh Ecumenical Conference Centre in England on the theme of **"Marist Spirituality in a Synodal Church"**. Around 65 people gathered from different countries including Vanuatu, New Caledonia, Brazil, Ireland, France, Italy, Spain and Norway. A rich program encouraged a warm family atmosphere.

One of the highlights of the week was a pilgrimage to Walsingham, the national Marian shrine in Norfolk. After Mass with the local Marists, participants walked the "holy mile" leading to the Shrine Chapel, praying the Rosary. Another day was spent in London, which included a visit to the Marist church of Notre Dame de France. Here are some thoughts from participants:
