Caring For Creation

The month of May marks the seventh anniversary of Pope Francis' land mark Encyclical – Laudato Si – On Care For Our Common Home. This is a call for action around the world to - Care for Creation.

Laudato Si translates to 'Praise be to You My Lord'. The purpose of this Encyclical is to invite all people to protect God's creation, to embrace a positive lifestyle change and to take care of those who are poor and vulnerable.

The 'Care of Creation' is an immediate reality confronting our near neighbours in Oceania. Our Marist missionaries have named the Care for Creation as a priority for their ministries. They are conducting education and training programs, clearing land and waterways, planting trees and mangroves and composting for local crops.

Sr. Lora sm has returned to her island home in Fiji to work with her own people on a Reforestation and Restoration program where the land, trees, local vegetation and water ways have been damaged or cleared for economic and other purposes. (see photo below)

Solar Power is a priority for all our communities and ministries in Oceania. Reliable power is a daily challenge and is vital to support the effective working of computers, equipment and machinery. Sr. Maria Fe smsm, in the Solomon Islands is leading the way at San Isidro, a 'Centre for Young People with Hearing Impairment', by installing solar power panels.

The project has been made all the more difficult during COVID as the good work of land clearing quickly becomes overgrown when work is interrupted.

EDUCATION - A PASSPORT TO A FUTURE

The people of the Solomon Islands have experienced significant challenges in recent times with COVID and then social and political unrest. The Marist Fathers and Marist Missionary Sisters are both actively involved in the ministry of education.

DALA-ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST COLLEGE - MARIST FATHERS

A 20 year old young man who is physically and intellectually challenged. He is bedridden and cannot provide self care or do anything by himself. His father has abandoned both him and his mother and so it is very difficult for his mother to care for him as he grows older. During Covid times the Centre has assigned a male assistant and female assistant to help with massages and exercises to support him while he is confined to his home.

MARIST MISSIONARY SISTERS

Hearing impairment in the Solomon Islands leads to personal and social disadvantage and exclusion.

San Isidro was originally established by the Marist Fathers to provide education and practical skills for young men and women, for example, trades, carpentry, sewing, agriculture, cooking and selling their goods at the local market.

The Sisters have now introduced education and language skills including the development of a local sign language. They are installing Solar power at the Centre to provide sufficient power for their educational resources and to reduce costs.
