I have just returned from a two week visit to Fiji and Tonga to meet with our Marist confreres and to follow-up on projects generously supported by our Marist supporters and donors.

In Suva, Fiji, I met with the Council of the Province of Oceania. This is the leadership team of the Province consisting of four confreres on their Provincial Council and Delegates representing the Sectors within Oceania, including PNG, Bougainville, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Samoa, Vanuatu, New Caledonia, Wallis and Futuna and Fiji. I was able to visit the Seminary and other local projects funded by MMC in Fiji.

In Tonga, I was welcomed by Fr. Chris Hifo sm in the Parish of St Anne & Joachim and then visited the Marist College that was significantly damaged by Cyclone Gita. MMC is providing on-going assistance for the repair and maintenance of school facilities and resources thanks to your support.

Also, a priority for MMC is the support, training and education of students and adults to promote the development and potential of the local community.
