The 21 Capitulants for the 23rd Oceania Provincial Chapter were welcomed on the evening of the 7th of January at Marist College. Fr Lote Raiwalui led them on a recollection day the following day then on Monday the reality of the missions of the Society of Mary in Oceania was clearly painted to us through the reports of Fr Provincial and the Provincial Bursar. This was further enhanced by the reports from the different sectors in the Province. The rest of the Chapter were dedicated to what Constitution no. 171 mandated us "to review the apostolic and spiritual progress of the province, to decide on policy for its life and activity." The Chapter was closed with a thanksgiving Eucharist.

During the Chapter, the Superior General formally announced the result of the election of the new provincial, Fr Milikiade Rayalu SM of Fiji to replace Fr Setefano Mataele SM of Tonga who was elected to one of the General Assistants in Rome. A special function after the Chapter was held to thank Fr Setefano and to welcome Fr Milikiade, and also the Superior General into the province.

END OF A 70 YEAR SCHOOL MINISTRY



As part of the prioritization of ministries in the province, the provincial administration after appropriate consultations, chose to end the seventy-year long commitment to education at St John's College, Cawaci, Fiji at the end of 2022.

St John's college was first established in 1894 by the Marist brothers. The first St John was closed in 1951 and was relocated to another site in the main island of Fiji. Bishop Foley then rebuilt Cawaci and in 1952 reestablished St John's college for boys only under the care of the Society of Mary.

On the 28th of January 2023 the ex-scholars and parents gathered at the college to farewell and to acknowledge with gratitude the contributions of the Marists towards the establishment, development and above all the education of the youths of the school in the last 70 years.
