BLESSING OF THE HOLY NAME OF MARY CHURCH—Tanagai, Solomon Islands.

On the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, Archbishop Chris Cardone blessed and opened the newly built church of the Holy Name of Mary at Tanagai. It is one of the only two parishes looked after by Marists in the Archdiocese of Honiara. The key man behind this work is Fr. Jacob Aba SM, standing close to Archbishop Chris in the photo. He is the parish priest, Sector Leader of the Marists in the Solomon and a councilor in the Provincial Administration. Jacob has expressed his gratitude to the Marist Mission Centre, benefactors, friends and Marist confreres for their financial support. Most of the fund, however, was from the parishioners fundraising drive. The architect and carpenters are all from Tanagai parish and the village of Dala in Malaita where Jacob comes from. The statue of Mary at the front and of Jesus at the back where the tabernacle is inside the Sacred Heart plus the Stations of the Cross were the works of a talented artist from Dala village too. According to Jacob, the church is a ship, MV 'Raiatea' which is written on the railing in front of the statue of Mary the captain of the ship. The statue of Jesus at the back is the main 'engine room' where the tabernacle is. The completion of the church is indeed a source of pride and joys for them. It is a testimony to their resilient, sacrifices and above all their faith.

PROVINCIAL COUNCIL EVALUATION AND PLANNING WEEK

The Provincial Council met in the third week of January at the Provincial House to evaluate goals and strategies set out by the last Provincial Chapter. Since this is our last year it is vitally important to assess what we have fulfilled so far and put down plan of actions for this year. We examined our ministries throughout the Province and the ongoing need to prioritize. We looked at the numbers in the various communities we have and since some of our confreres have died young or work elsewhere in the Society we may never achieve the desire to have 4 or 5 members in a community. Perhaps a matter of serious concern is the low average lifespan of Oceanians and the effects of unhealthy lifestyle which contributed to loss of young Marists and early retirement not because of age but of health. We finally confirmed some appointments and plan the movement of council members in the coming months.
