

## CYCLONE JUDY AND CYCLONE KEVIN

Severe Tropical Cyclones Judy and Kevin were a pair of tropical cyclones that made a landfall within 48 hours of each other in Vanuatu causing extensive damages and plunged the island especially Tanna and the capital Port Villa into a state of emergency. At Port Orly, there was no report of damage. Frs. Benedict, Epoki and Raymond are all safe there. The Sector leader, Fr. Lolesio Taina reported that "water systems and





telecommunication were completely out in all parts of the country. The two powerful cyclones uprooted trees, blew away roofs of many homes leaving thousands of people without electricity and water supply." The Sector House at Paray was unscathed except for Fr. Rodet's 'Nakmal' was laid to rest.
