The two sessions, since the last Bulletin, dealt with the two main ministries of the Province—Parish ministry and education, and the continuing need for prioritization. Fr John Crispin sm (retired), who has spent most of his 55

years as a priest in parishes, was the guest speaker sharing his experience on parish ministry. Half of the province's personnel are in parish ministry and John's sharing is a continuation of the effort towards *what a Marist parish should look like*. Fr Aisake Vaisima sm presented the thinking of the Society on education ministry and in particular, school ministry, and the challenges facing this ministry in the Province. One of the challenges is the ownership of schools and thus the question on *what is the future of the school ministry in the Province*. Fr Provincial presented the call of the General Chapter since 2009 for prioritization of ministries. Delegates were encouraged to continue the process of prioritization by utilizing the criteria for evaluating ministries proposed by the 2017 General Chapter Statement and Decisions no.21. The Council of the Province will have 2 more sessions to go.

Friendship Fellowship Week for over 300 women of 3 parishes



In the midst of the pandemic, a trusting and courageous women's league group from Our Lady of Assumption parish in Buka, Bougainville travelled over 900 km to join the women of Hohola parish in Port Moresby and the women of Kanosia parish from Bereina diocese 160 km northwest of Port Moresby for a week-long friendship fellowship

The fellowship was organized by the parish priest of Hohola, Fr Wesley Manusm and the women of the parish. Hohola and Kanosia parishes are currently under the care of the Marists in Papua New Guinea. The parish in Buka was also looked after by Marists in Bougainville for decades.

The Bishop of the Archdiocese of Port Moresby, Cardinal Sir John Ribat msc graced the fellowship when he visited and addressed them. The week-long fellowship was spirit-filled with joy, affirmation, entertainment, and empowerment to participate fully as women in fulfilling the mission of Christ in the parishes.

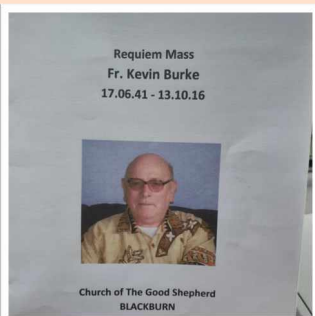
Yet to return home
