UPDATES ON THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC as of last week of September 21

While most of the island nations in the Pacific are still in covid-free status they are nevertheless affected by the pandemic as every other nation in the world. Despite the high numbers of infections and deaths in **Fiji**, the fully vaccinated has reached the threshold where the government decides that it is enough for everyone to return to a limited normal by the 4th October. The houses of worship, for instance, will be allowed only 80% capacity of the venue for the fully vaccinated only, masks and 2-metre physical distancing. The Archdiocese has recommended a special opening ceremony to welcome everyone to the Eucharist after 5 months. Children under the age of 18 have begun their vaccination. So far, 17,996 children have been vaccinated. **Papua New Guinea** has pushed the panic button early on in the pandemic but has petered off noticeably in its data collection. Many have now considered Covid-19 as another disease alongside others like malaria, tuberculosis, typhoid, cholera, etc. However, many yet believe that the pandemic has become too much for the Health ministry to handle. **New Caledonia**, after only 21 days of the second wave, has amassed a high rate of infections, hospitalization and deaths. Our prayers go out to New Caledonia as they valiantly fight against the Covid through their vaccination drive.
