## **GENERAL ADMINISTRATION**


Fr John Larsen is now in Brazil where he will visit the confreres, and where he will also attend the South America District Chapter in the first week of July.

In January 2021, Pope Francis announced the appointment of our confrere, Rd. Paul Martin, the Bishop of Christchurch, to the role of *Coadjutor Archbishop of Wellington*, to assist Card. John Dew, the Metropolitan Archbishop of Aotearoa New Zealand. The

appointment took effect immediately, but Paul remained in Christchurch until his successor was appointed. From this week Paul officially resides in Wellington.

On 13 June a delegation of our Canadian confreres went to Ottawa for the episcopal ordination of Rd. Yvan Mathieu. The celebration, attended by 26 bishops, 2 cardinals and a many faithful, was presided over by bishop Marcel Damphousse, who warmly welcomed Yvan into the diocese.
