Through a synodal process the confreres reviewed the implementation of the decisions of the last Provincial Chapter, and considered future directions and policies. A result of the fraternal meeting was a freeing from being overly concerned about our diminishment, ageing, the departures from significant ministries. It proved to be an invitation to be content at finding God in the reality of the present moment - moving ahead in hope and bearing the compassionate love of God wherever we find ourselves.

An afternoon Chapter of Election elected Frs Gerard Hall and Kevin Redmond as delegates to the 2025 General Chapter.



MARAYONG COMMUNITY

Fr Setefano Mataele, GA link person for the Omnes Gentes Communities, has carried out a visitation of the community in Marayong, Sydney, Australia. He gave some input to the community on the Constitutions, specifically Const. 114-116. The discussion highlighted the importance of daily conversion, emphasizing scripture reading, spiritual reading, regular confession, and the grace received from serving others. Amongst other things there was a focus on balancing personal spiritual development with community responsibilities, and the significance of dedicating personal time for spiritual exercises while actively engaging in community life.
